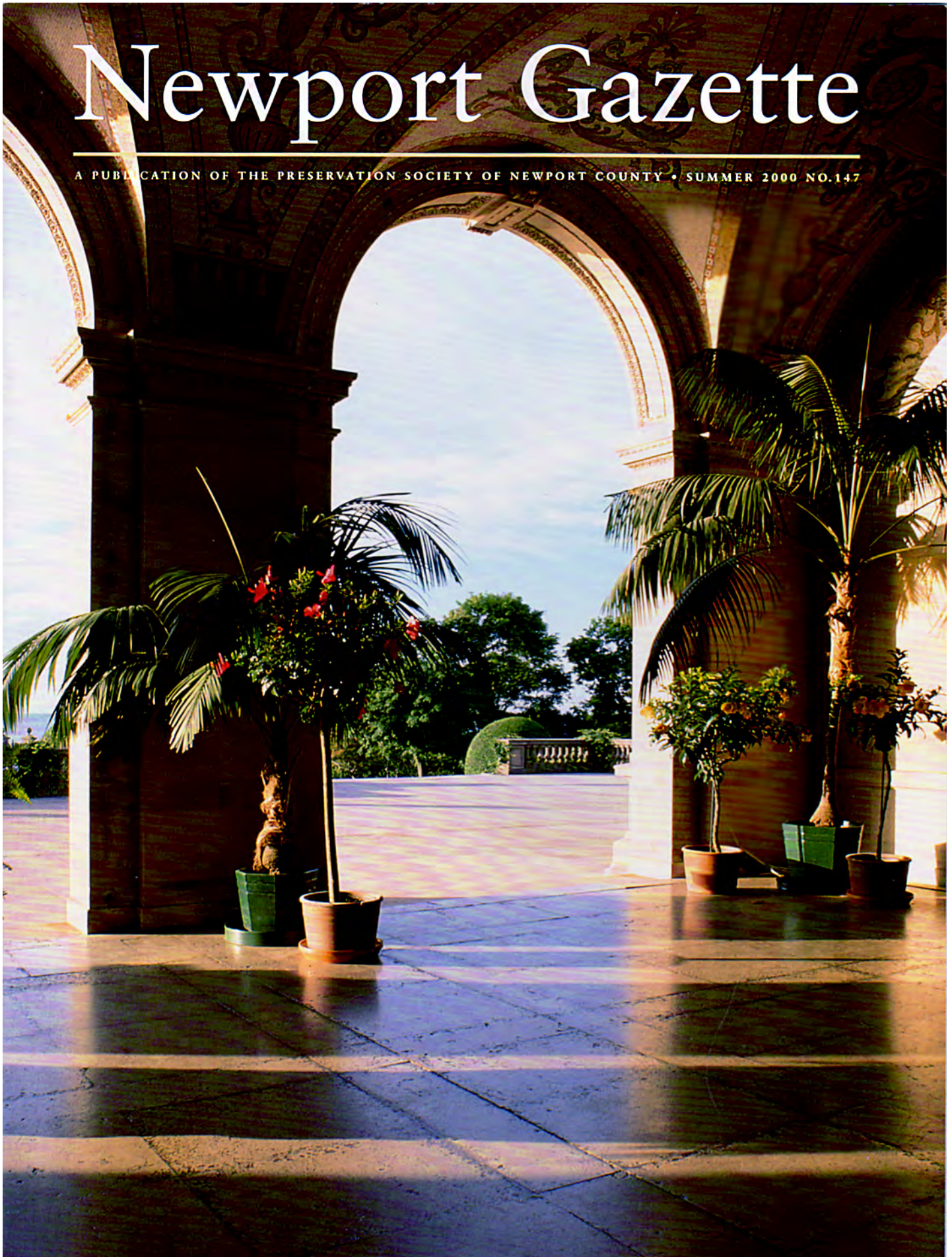

## NEWMAN RESTORATION EXHIBIT DRAWS SUPPORTERS TO NEW YORK CITY

On April 11, more than 80 Preservation Society members, supporters and friends turned out at a preview reception for the Howard Newman Restoration Exhibit at The Century Club in New York City. This impressive exhibit focused on Mr. Newman's achievements in the restoration of Preservation Society objects. From his studio in Newport, he has actively restored works of silver, lead, tin and enamel decorative objects in the Preservation Society's collection for more than a decade. Also highlighted were several of the artist's contemporary sculptures.

At the reception, guests were warmly greeted by Preservation

Society President Armin Allen, CEO Trudy Coxé and Curator Paul Miller. Among the most talked-about restored objects were a pair of 19th century Chinese export ostrich egg cups from Chepstow, an 1853 Tiffany silver centerpiece from the dining room at Chateau-sur-Mer, and an 1880 French jewel casket from the Gothic room at Marble House.

After closing the exhibit on May 5, Jonathan P. Harding, Curator at The Century Club, remarked, "Howard's exhibition did not last long enough, and I will be in hot water when everyone realizes that I've returned all those beautiful objects to Newport without a fight!"
